OVERVIEW

Bob Hazlett, MAG project manager, provided a brief overview of the study, focusing on the key framework elements of commuter rail and access management. Mr. Hazlett advised that public meetings were scheduled for the project in June and the study team was here to discuss the study progress and seek input.

DISCUSSION

Councilman Michael Nowakowski asked about funding sources for study recommendations. Mr. Hazlett indicated that a major source could likely be from a future regional transportation tax, similar to Proposition 400. Councilman Nowakowski questioned whether there was a connection to the current transit funding ballot initiative and this US-60/Grand Avenue COMPASS project and commented that he does not want people to be confused regarding the ballot initiative.
