




U.S. and Mexico Tourism 2011


Annual Earnings, Selected AZ Export-Oriented Industries

Visitor Spending 1998-2012


51% of Arizona Visitor Spending is in Maricopa County


Maximum spending in Metro Phoenix by Mexican Visitors

Expenditures Per Visitor Party (\$) by City, 2007-08




Potential of Spending by Mexican Visitors

Adding ONE Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Agent at each of the 33 major Ports of Entry (POE)* can impact the U.S. economy as a whole:

- **\$65.8 million total increase in Gross Domestic Product (GDP)**
 - \$2 million per CBP staff member added
- **\$21.2 million total in value of time savings**
 - \$640,000 per CBP staff member added
- **1,094 annual jobs added**
 - 33 jobs per CBP staff member added



** The 33 POEs were selected by the U.S. Customs and Border Protection as those most likely to be impacted. (17 passenger land crossings POE, 12 major freight crossing POE, and 4 passenger airport POE.)*

Streamlining the Mexican Visa Process


Comments from the Federal Register when New Mexico expanded their border:

- **A Border Crossing Card is one of the most secure travel documents used at the border and allows for faster processing at both the port of entry and interior immigration checkpoints.**
- **Many commenters, including local police and sheriff departments stated that the expansion would have no negative effect on security in the region.**
- **Customs and Border Patrol believed the expand border zone will allow CPB to better allocate its resources while enhancing its enforcement posture.**


