Sunset: ADOT TEA and SRTS Programs

Programmed for the MAG region (all years):

- TEA ≈ \$6.2 million
- SRTS ≈ \$3.6 million

Annual Allocation Statewide for programming:

TA Program ≈ \$8.0 million, or for MAP-21 authorized years ≈ \$16.0 million

Currently statewide TEA/SRTS is over-programmed

Two step approach for TA Program

Near Term FY 2013-14

- Protect the OA for FFY 2013-14. Assist with ADOT commitments under the sunset programs.
- Evaluated funding shortages for programmed project phases in MAG region
- Balance of OA carried to FY2015.

Long Term FY 2015-18

- Determine MAG priorities and eligible activities
- Assign staff and committee
- Develop program evaluation & performance criteria
- Schedule Call For Projects (**Summer 2013**)
- Collect and evaluate applications
- Approve List of projects
- Program in the TIP

Results of Information Request for Short Term

- Based on FHWA Concurrence & Current Fed Fund Policies
- Eligible projects: ADOT historic competitively awarded and programmed
- Fund unmet eligible project needs based on scope and current engineering estimates
- Program project changes/funding increases to ensure that projects continue and complete
