








The Regional Community Network



Current Status

- 10 Gb redundant network connections to most locations
- Traffic camera sharing
- Videoconferencing unit
- Dark fiber
- 911 communications path
- Video/Audio bridging service
- Fiber mapping project
- Camera software pilot
- Public safety camera sharing
- On-call support
- Troubleshooting and repair for fiber, hardware, software and network issues



No-Cost Service Additions

- Approval allowed at TAG and ITS for additional services that can run on the existing network



