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April 5, 2012 Program Implementation Status

Phase I

- Have met with several state and local agencies to identify solutions to state and federal criteria of needing an address to provide services.
- Met with local municipalities and private utility companies to determine promising practices in assisting ACP participants who will need to utilize services such as utilities, libraries and recreational centers.
- Currently finalizing solutions for compliance with ACP laws with major state agencies that will mostly interact with ACP participants.
- Sample policies being created to assist agencies when interacting with ACP participants.

Phase II

- Attending DV program meetings to seek Application Assistants for ACP.
- Have started scheduling and providing training for Application Assistants (DV and Sexual Assault Programs).
- Will be collaborating with AzCADV for continual outreach to DV and Sexual Assault Programs for staff training.
- Fines levied started as of January 1. Fines are slowly rolling into the program.

Phase III

- Date for enrolling participants has been rescheduled to June of 2012 to accommodate agencies needs to address internal policies and training.
- Will notify agencies of official date of enrolling participants.
- Will meet with smaller agencies that will have less interaction with ACP participants as program starts.
- Expected by year three of program, ACP will have approximately 1200 participants enrolled. This equals to approximately 600 households.
- Potential Impact of Interaction: Consumers served on average by major state and local agencies, ACP participants will potentially compromise of 1/10 of 1% of those same consumers.
