



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Highway Trust Fund in decline

Outlays exceeding gas tax receipts since the turn of the century
Only general fund transfers have kept the trust fund solvent

In billions



*2012-2020 numbers are based on most recent CBO projections- August 27th, 2012

**DOT requires a minimum \$6 billion cushion, hence the HTF hits the red before crossing zero.

HTF TWO PART ISSUE: LONG TERM SUSTAINABILITY AND SHORT TERM CASH FLOW


LONG TERM: Sustainability

- Historic issue; annual shortages reoccur
- Federal Gasoline Sales Tax
- Statewide: 75% of projects are Federal Aid
- Funding cuts, project delays, ongoing funding uncertainty.

SHORT TERM: Cash Flow

- HTF should maintain a \$4 Billion balance
- Implement Cash Management Measure
- Congressional Action needed
 - Infusion from General Fund

FHWA Methods to Address HTF Cash Flow Should Congress not act:

Should a situation occur where FHWA cannot fully reimburse States, the agency may take some or all of the following actions:

- Move from daily to weekly reimbursements (little to no effect on ADOT and local agencies)
- Align reimbursements with Trust Fund deposits; twice monthly (may slow down requested reimbursements)
- Make proportional payments to States based on available Trust Fund cash; **example reimburse 60% of each request** (major impact to state and local agencies; contract amendments, project delays, . . .)

These are some of the possible actions FHWA might take in the event of a cash shortfall. The specific actions would depend on the exact nature of the shortfall.
