SUBJECT: CALL FOR PROJECTS: SUMMARY OF SUBMITTED APPLICATIONS

On August 10, 2015, MAG announced a Call for Projects for Federal Highway Administration sub-allocated Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ), PM-2.5 Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ-2.5), Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP-MAG), and Surface Transportation Program (STP-MAG) funding. Completed and signed project applications that were submitted by the due date of Monday, September 21, 2015, before 10:00 a.m., have been posted to the MAG website and are available for review.
