You are eligible to file an appeal if:

- **You returned address additions or corrections to the 2010 Census Address List after your LUCA review, or**
- **You challenged the count of addresses in one or more census blocks on the Address Count List after your LUCA review, or**
- **You certified to the Census Bureau after your LUCA review that the 2010 Census Address List was correct and required no update**

The Files

■ ***Full Address List (fal)***

- Includes blocks with no addresses
- Identifies Other Living Quarters (OLQ) Y/N

■ ***Full Address Count List (fac1)***

- Actual count of addresses by block for HU and OLO

■ ***Detailed Feedback Address List (dfal)***

- Disposition of every address submitted to the Census Bureau or deleted from the original MAF during address canvassing

■ ***Detailed Feedback Address Count Challenge List (dfaccl)***

- Count by block of original and final addresses on MAF for those blocks that have different counts from the original MAF

■ ***Feedback Address Update Summary Report (fausr)***

Considerations for Review of the Detailed Feedback Address List

- The Census Bureau may have rejected many units, but you may only appeal the following Census Processing Codes:
 - A8: Added address not found
 - A10: Added address is a nonresidential address with no residential units
 - C6: Changed address not found
 - C9: Changed address is a nonresidential address with no residential units
 - X1: Address canvassing operation did not find address

Considerations for Review of the Detailed Feedback Address List

- No other jurisdiction received your A8s, A10s, C6s and C9s
- The County has received an updated Master Address File for the entire County and is already doing some analysis on the X1s that may help you
- MAG has signed the County confidentiality agreement and may be able to identify the records the county has reviewed and those that need further follow up within your jurisdiction

Review Detailed Feedback Address Count Challenge List

- **You may also appeal addresses you believe are still missing from blocks whose address counts you challenged during your LUCA review, as evidenced by the revised address counts for those blocks shown on the Detailed Feedback Address Count Challenge List**

	Field Name	Field Description
1	Census Tract Number	Up to a 4-digit number followed by a decimal point and a 2-digit suffix, if applicable, includes a period for suffixed tracts. If no suffix, includes period and zero fill
2	Census Block Number	Census 2000 tabulation block number. Up to a 4-digit number (no suffix)
3	Original Census Count of Housing Unit Addresses	Number of housing addresses originally recorded in the <i>Census Count of Housing Unit Addresses</i> column for each block on the Address Count List
4	Participant Count of Housing Unit Addresses	The number of housing unit addresses submitted by the participant for that block
5	Final Count of Housing Unit Addresses	Number of housing unit addresses currently listed in the MTDB for that block
6	Original Census Count of Other Living Quarters Address	Number of other living quarters addresses originally recorded in the <i>Census Count of Group Quarters Addresses</i> column for each block on the Address Count List
7	Participant Count of Other Living Quarters Addresses	Number of other living quarters addresses submitted by the participant for that block
8	Final Count of Other Living Quarters Addresses	Number of other living quarters currently listed in the MTDB for that block

Considerations for Review of the Detailed Feedback Address Count Challenge List

- Which blocks have highest differences between original MAF and final MAF?
- Is there an issue with Housing Units identified as Other Living Quarters?
- Are there still addresses missing from blocks whose address counts you challenged during your LUCA review?
- Other suggestions from member agencies?

Considerations for Review of the Full Address List

- Are any of the X1s from the Detailed Feedback Address List identified as X1s because they are duplicates of addresses already in the Full Address List?
- Which records have no MAFID? This indicates there are no addresses in this block. Is this correct?
- Other suggestions from member agencies?

Considerations for Review of the Full Address Count List

- Does the full count of addresses by block for your jurisdiction seem reasonable?
- Are the issues, if any, in blocks you may challenge?
- Other suggestions from member agencies?

Help! How should I start?

- Review documentation from the Census Bureau. It is fairly thorough and easy to understand
- Review Detailed Feedback Address List
 - Extract records that have problems
 - Check for duplicates between this and full address list
 - Evaluate all A8, A10, C6 and C9 first (MAG and County may be able to help get started on the X1s)
 - Get as many people on your confidentiality list as possible – many people can help pull documentation

Help! How can/can't MAG help me?

- Did sign the County Confidentiality Agreement to be able to review X1s on County Detailed Feedback Address List (not necessarily inclusive)
- Can contact Census Bureau with questions and prepare FAQ
- Can provide aerials of blocks with MAF changes or other blocks on request and letter from Aerials Express (sbridwell@mag.maricopa.gov)
- Can provide feedback to you on blocks from County's Detailed Feedback Address List for your jurisdiction

Help! How can/can't MAG help me?

- Can provide feedback to you on blocks from County's Detailed Feedback Address Count Challenge List for your jurisdiction
- Can provide Certificates of Occupancy provided by your jurisdiction to MAG. Many have APNs
- Can help you create a plan of action
- Can provide sample letters for you to facilitate getting multifamily information
- Cannot research all issues for you
- Cannot cumulate all documentation for you for addresses identified
- Further comments/questions

Help! How can/can't the County help me?

- Can review X1s from County Detailed Feedback Address List (not necessarily inclusive)
- Can get APNs for most single family and some multi family X1s, collect documentation from Assessor's Office and send to Census Bureau
- Can provide to MAG a list of MAFIDs for those records that the County will be responding to the Census Bureau (MAG will determine agency and pass on relevant IDs)

Help! How can/can't the County help me?

- Can provide to MAG a list of MAFIDs for those records that the County will not be responding to the Census Bureau (MAG will determine agency and pass on relevant IDs)
- Can provide to MAG an ArcGIS application to facilitate printing Assessor records from the Web
- Cannot research additional issues for you
- Cannot cumulate all documentation for you for other addresses
- Further comments/questions

Help! What if my jurisdiction did not submit changes to the original MAF?

- **Don't panic**
- **Let MAG know if you would like MAG to research any issues from the County file**
- **If there are issues, sign the County Confidentiality Agreement and work through the County (must be done this week)**
- **You will still be responsible for collecting relevant documentation before the County has to submit their final files**

Help! How do I appeal?

- **The Census Bureau Users Guide spells out the steps to appeal**
- **Follow the instructions exactly**
- **Get your responses in no later than 30 calendar days after receipt of materials**
- **Get everything in writing**
- **Ensure you have the correct documentation for each appealed address**
- **Further comments/questions**

Help! What is valid documentation?

- The Census Bureau Users Guide spells out possible supporting documentation
- All documentation must be printed
- Assessor Records work very well. Try to get the Assessor Parcel Number for each address
- Certificates of Occupancy can link addresses with parcel numbers. MAG will supply addresses and parcel numbers you have provided us for residential completions
- Further comments/questions

Help! What if I found something that is not eligible to report?

- **There is another major Census Bureau program looming – the New Construction Program (NCP)**
- **The NCP is primarily for all new construction that happened since the address canvassing operation**
- **MAG is compiling lists for each jurisdiction of all residential completions (certificates of occupancy) and new permits for you to use as a starting point for the NCP**
