SUBJECT: STREET COMMITTEE PRESENTATIONS FOR PM-10 PAVE UNPAVED ROAD APPLICATIONS AND PM-10 STREET SWEEPERS

Signed and complete applications for PM-10 Certified Street Sweepers and PM-10 Pave Unpaved Roads were due on Friday September 18, 2009 at noon/12:00 p.m. There were nine PM-10 Certified Street Sweepers totaling \$1,664,019 in federal fund requests, and twelve PM-10 Pave Unpaved Roads totaling \$10,139,196 in federal fund requests. As outlined in the fiscal year (FY) 2009 MAG Transportation Programming Guidebook, the available federal funds to be programmed through the MAG competitive selection process for inclusion in the MAG TIP are:

- PM-10 Certified Street Sweepers in FY 2010- \$1,310,000, federal CMAQ funds
- PM-10 Pave Unpaved Road projects in FY 2013 - \$4,513,000, federal CMAQ funds

A project information sheet with limited application information is attached per application. Please note, there are many applications that have multiple segments as noted on the bottom footer, example: Application 4, Segment 1 of 10. If an application has more than one segment, the information pertaining to the total project costs and description will be repeated at the top, while the segment information will vary depending the segment. Complete applications will not be mailed out, but rather posted online for additional review.

The Street Committee is tasked with reviewing the project information in the federal fund project applications for PM-10 Pave Unpaved Roads and PM-10 Certified Street Sweepers. The first Street Committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 13, 2009 at 9:00 a.m.

There will not be presentations of the PM-10 Street Sweeper applications, but a committee review of the application information. The presentations will be limited to PM-10 Pave Unpaved Road applications. The applicants/presenters will be given a maximum of 3 minutes to present their applications.

The presentations will be verbal, and the location map, cross section, and site visit photos of the project that was submitted with the application will be provided by MAG staff. The applicant/presenters will not hand out additional material, nor use additional visual aids. After each of the project application presentations, the Street Committee will be able to discuss the project with the applicant. **The applicant/presenter will need to describe the location of the project, current right of way, utilities, and environmental, the proposed project and how it will address the right of way, utilities, and environmental**

issues (if needed), the ADT and how it was determined, the estimated costs of the project, and other items the applicant/presenter would like to mention.

The applicant is allowed to revise project information based from the Committee's questions, or other changes necessary to improve the data provided in the application. The applicant can do this at the first meeting, and/or the applicant also has the opportunity to clarify information on the application for the second Street Committee meeting. The Street Committee will not provide a ranking of projects and all applications and Committee comments will be forwarded to the AQTAC.

At the Street Committee meeting in November, the Committee and applicant will make final comments and clarification on application information for transmittal to the Air Quality Technical Advisory Committee (AQTAC).
