- Community survey respondents indicated a desire for access to healthcare and shopping.
- Focus group participants indicated a desire for service to downtown Phoenix, Arrowhead Towne Center, and shopping centers in Surprise.
- Focus groups also identified Grand Avenue as a perceived barrier to travel.
- Local circulator would provide access to Banner Boswell Medical Center and shopping centers along Del Webb Blvd.
- Expanded local circulator will serve Old Town Peoria and could provide service that extends beyond the Grand Avenue border.
- Valley Metro Route 106 would provide more frequent service to Banner Boswell Medical Center.
- An extension of Valley Metro Route 186 or 170 would provide direct access to Arrowhead Towne Center.
