

Schools in the City of Surprise have never had a Safe Routes to School program. Consequently, many students and parents rely on the family vehicle to get to and from school everyday. Most Dysart USD elementary schools are located within a neighborhood and serve students within a radius of 1 or 2 miles. Even at these short distances, parents do not feel safe to allow their children to walk or bike to school due to real or perceived dangerous conditions on the roadway. At some locations around the City, sidewalks or bike lanes are missing. This creates an unsafe condition for everyone, but especially for school children. Because most kids are driven to school, their parents' vehicles create massive traffic congestion near the schools, which becomes an unsafe conditions for walking and biking; further deterring parents from allowing their children to walk or bike to school.
