The Maricopa County Region will house 55 people per month for a total of 165 chronic individuals by August 31, 2013 and will maintain a placement rate of 50 -55 per month until 2015.

Baseline: Current HPR & Take Down Target

- Total Take Down Target = 2678
- Take Down Target for Chronic Only = 1622 (including chronic veterans)
- Current Monthly Housing Placement Rate for Chronic = 44
