- Improve **coordination**
- Enhance system capacity to intervene **timely** and **effectively**
- Ensure programs are **meeting needs** and **ending homelessness**
- **Housing** ends homelessness

- August Pilot Trainings
  - UMOM / Family Partners
  - Human Services Campus / HEART partners
- October Community-Wide Training
  - 98 attendees
  - 34 agencies represented

# Phase One Phoenix

- January 2014 – December 2014
  - Human Service Campus Partners
  - UMOM New Day Centers
- Goal: Develop training protocol/ implement monthly trainings
- Goal: ES & Outreach pre-screen trained March
- Goal: Full assessment training May-June
- Goal: Phase Two / referrals July



## SNAP's Weekly Focus

- ✓ Prioritize chronically homeless in PSH
- ✓ Use Coordinated Assessment to prioritize
- ✓ DON'T use a first-come-first-served approach
- ✓ Leverage mainstream services and funding
- ✓ Consider:
  - Can funding for services be covered by other federal or local partners?
  - Are services essential to connecting to or maintaining HOUSING?






# 2012 CoC Program Total Award \$25,211,347




# Permanent Supportive Housing



# Transitional Housing




