





# Accelerator Model

- 44 = Maricopa County Q1 2013 Housing Placement Rate
- 2,678 = Total Take Down Target
- 1,622 = Take Down Target for Chronic Only
  
- **Rate of 55 per month** over three months
  
- **Continuous housing placement rate needs to be 50-55** per month to end chronic homelessness by December 2015

# Strategies that Will “Bend the Lines”

- **Data:** Effective use of data drives results
- **Mainstream Resources:** Mainstream systems engagement and integration with targeted homeless programs is critically important to overall success
- **Targeting:** Directing existing and new resources more effectively leads to better outcomes
- **Using Evidence:** Implementing evidence-informed practices – including Housing First - requires the commitment of funders and providers
- **Investments:** New investments, when strategically deployed, lead to reductions in homelessness



## Getting to Zero

- Finalize commitments of permanent housing turnover
- Solidify opportunities for repurposing and reallocation of transitional housing
- Create regional commitments of HUD mainstream resources
- Identify gaps and use data to drive decisions
- Continuous communication
- Focused work groups: coordinated intake/assessment, street outreach, permanent housing
- Continue 100-Day planning process



## Recommendation:

**Align Continuum of Care to December 2015 goals:**

- **End chronic homelessness and vulnerable family homelessness**
- **Measure to functional zero**
- **Focus on mainstream resources**
- **Use data to drive decisions**
- **Identify new resources**
- **Continue to track “1,000 units”**
- **Unify with United Way Advisory Council**
