Intended results

- Recognize the gaps in the system.
- Analyze data to reach new conclusions.
- Hold abusers accountable.
- Streamline the process.
- Develop metrics to compare across organizations.
- Create common measurements to which each organization contributes.

How do we measure success?

- Reduction on fatalities.
- Victims have easier access to services.
- More people reporting DV because they now have faith in the system.
- Collaborative relationships between municipalities and tribal communities.
- Evidence protected regardless of jurisdiction.
- Increase in cross jurisdictional support.

Challenges/barriers

- Power struggles.
- Collaboration takes time which equals money.
- Resistance to change.
- Turf issues.
- Educate funders.

What have we learned?

- Cross systems change makers/stakeholders reduce fatalities.
- Coordinated assessments/screening streamlines processes to help victims.

How will it be different this time?

- Continue to share electronic files as much as possible.
- More offender tracking.
- Consider how collaborations can benefit organizations financially.
- Continue to have meaningful meetings.
