




TIGER VIII: Notice of Funding Opportunity

- ▶ \$500 million available through competitive merit-based grant program
 - ▶ Eligible applicants: any governmental entity (city, county, state, tribe, MPO, etc.)
 - ▶ Eligible projects: highways, bridges, transit, bike/ped, freight rail, passenger rail, intermodal facilities, ports
 - ▶ Urban grants: \$5 to \$100 million, 20% local match requirement
 - ▶ Rural grants: \$1 to \$100 million, no local match requirement

TIGER VIII: Considerations

- ▶ Demonstrated project readiness
 - ▶ Technical feasibility: engineering and design to support quick construction upon award
 - ▶ Financial feasibility: evidence of financial commitments, right-of-way
 - ▶ Schedule: pre-construction complete to obligate funds by June 30, 2019
 - ▶ Environmental: environmental approvals and permits achieved (e.g., NEPA)
- ▶ Extensive benefit-cost analysis required
- ▶ Economic impact analysis optional
- ▶ Regionally-supported projects valued

Applicant: MAG

TIGER Grant Request: \$25 million

Total Project Cost: \$89.5 million

Regionally Supported, Rural:

SR 347 Grade Separation Project

Applicant: ADOT

TIGER Grant Award: \$15 million

Total Project Cost: \$55 million

Phoenix Submission:

Grande Canal Bike and Pedestrian Improvements

Applicant: City of Phoenix

TIGER Grant Award: \$10.3 million

Total Project Cost: \$16 million

TIGER VIII: Regional Approach

- ▶ MAG issued call for non-transit projects: deadline March 28, 2016.
- ▶ Project submissions to be reviewed at March 31, 2016 Transportation Review Committee.
 - ▶ Intent to identify a regionally-supported rural and urban project.
 - ▶ Valley Metro vetted transit projects and has submitted dedicated transit ramps for consideration.
- ▶ Sponsoring/lead applicant responsible for preparing and submitting application.
- ▶ Requests for support from Pima Association of Governments, Sun Corridor Metropolitan Planning Organization.
