2010 Domestic Violence Protocol Evaluation Project  
Promising Practices Roundtable  
Evaluation Summary**

The evaluation surveys from the Domestic Violence Protocol Evaluation Project (PEP) Promising Practices Roundtable were positive. Data gathered by the surveys was developed into a matrix. Detailed information is available in the matrix. This document provides a summary of the evaluation results.

Plenary Sessions

Eighty percent gave positive scores for the plenary speakers including the Local Promising Practices Panel and the keynote speaker, Lt. Mark Wynn. Participants indicated all presenters were very knowledgeable. Many participants commented on Lt. Wynn's presentation. They found him to be "eloquent and inspiring," "an amazing person," and "a great leader" in addressing domestic violence.

Breakout Sessions

Eighty four percent scored the workshop presenters positively and said they would be able to use the information in their work. Participants requested that workshop materials be made available after the event for future use. Comments indicated participants wished the event had been a two-day training. Specifically, one participant commented, "Awesome training! Best I've ever attended. I think this should be mandatory for all people working with families and children in Arizona."

Venue

Eighty five percent scored the venue as comfortable and accommodating. Many positive comments were received about the venue location, the convenience of valet parking, size of the breakout session rooms, and the food. One participant commented, "Wonderful conference with amazing speakers. Can't wait to share information with my fellow co-workers."

Other

A few participants noted challenges with hearing speakers in the ballroom, and confusion about parking. Opportunities to address both situations at future events has been discussed and noted by MAG staff.
