- Enhance coordination with FACs.



Strengthen Communication

- Identify communication processes.
- Increase information sharing.
- Conduct webinars.



Develop Protocol

- Research lethality assessment tools.
- Coordinate discussions.

- Explore use of volunteers and/or victim advocates.



- Explore assessment tools.




Definitions, Techniques and Forms
