

## **MAG RATP Preproposer Conference Notes 11-15-16**

Jacobs asked what level of support MAG would have in the public outreach effort. Jason Stephens of MAG said it would be about 50-50.

Jacobs asked about the reference to the City of Vancouver's Healthy City Initiative in the RFP. Jason Stephens of MAG stated that he wants the consultants to be looking at this initiative and Charles Montgomery's book Happy City. He said the plan is about social connection and moving people – not vehicles.

Jason Stephens of MAG said he is looking for cutting edge, big, bold ideas and he is looking for the consultants to do something other than "11 x "17 foldouts.

KOA Corporation asked if MAG is looking for previously produced graphics. Jason Stephens of MAG stated that he is looking for creativity in how connections between placemaking, bicycle and pedestrian facilities and economic capacity are made. These connections should be made in visual form.

Amec Foster Wheeler asked if public involvement would be confined to one task as it is listed under one task. Jason Stephens of MAG stated he is not restricting public outreach to a certain task.

CivTech asked if a sign in sheet will be posted on the website. Jason Stephens of MAG said yes.

Amec Foster Wheeler asked if the idea of complete corridors was limited to a specific number. Jason Stephens of MAG said no.

Jacobs asked if the consultant would be responsible for just the grant narrative or the entire grant. Jason Stephens of MAG said the entire grant.

Jacobs asked if this was more of a policy type, guidance document versus a technical document. Jason Stephens of MAG said yes.
