- Who should manage the program/services?

Service Recommendations

- Developed through multiple outreach efforts:
 - PMT guidance and assistance
 - Four-phase community outreach
 - Focus groups
 - Stakeholder input
- Customized for each community in the study area
- Include near-, mid-, and long-term recommendations

Service Recommendations

- Consideration of regional concerns
 - Study previous public transportation efforts and “lessons learned”
 - Inventory of existing vehicles and potential for use in future endeavors
- Explore feasibility of
 - Contracted services
 - Public Private Partnerships (PPP)
 - Taxi voucher programs



Recommendation	Primary communities served	Catalyst	Impact(s)	Priority
Creation of a local circulator	El Mirage, Surprise/Sun City Grand, Sun City, and Sun City West	Focus groups	Access to local activity centers, connection to regional transit network	Near-term
Consolidate Valley Metro's Grand Avenue Limited and Express Route 571; increase span of service to cover mid-day hours	All via Glendale, Peoria, and Surprise	Community survey, focus groups	Improved access to downtown Phoenix	Near-term
Create local volunteer driver program	Sun City Festival	Focus groups	Improved access to key activity centers in Sun City Festival and Surprise	Near-term
Modify existing Glendale and Peoria transit routes to better align with consolidated express route	Glendale and Peoria	Consolidated express route recommendation	Improved access between Northwest Valley and regional transit network	Near-term
Divide proposed local circulator into two separate routes and increase each route's coverage area	El Mirage, Peoria, Surprise/Sun City Grand, Sun City, Sun City West, and Youngtown (and potentially Luke AFB)	Community survey, focus groups	Expanded service area, access to local activity centers, connection to regional transit network	Mid-term
Extend Valley Metro Route 186 or Route 170 into Sun City	Sun City	Focus groups	Direct access from Sun City to Arrowhead Towne Center	Mid-term
Increase the frequency on Valley Metro Route 106 or maintain existing frequency and serve Banner Boswell Medical Center on all trips	Peoria, Sun City, and Youngtown	Community survey	Improved access to Banner Boswell Medical Center (local) and Scottsdale (regional)	Mid-term
Implement high capacity transit service from Surprise to downtown Phoenix along Grand Avenue (multi-phased implementation starting in downtown Phoenix; part of larger regional high capacity transit; connect to light rail at Central Ave. and Van Buren)	All via Glendale, Peoria, and Surprise	Community survey	Improved access to downtown Phoenix and beyond; would ultimately replace consolidated Grand Avenue express route	Long-term
Consolidate Northwest Valley fixed-route and demand-response services under a single brand, locally administered	All	Community survey	Brand unity, improved service coordination, cost-effective service provision	Long-term
Provide limited express service from Sun City Festival and Surprise	Sun City Festival	Focus groups	Builds upon volunteer driver program; would provide regular service between Sun City Festival and Surprise	Long-term

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


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Legend
