4a. Local Update of Census Address Program

The Census Bureau is actively pursuing preparations for Census 2010. An important factor in getting a good count is an accurate address list. The LUCA program provides local governments with an opportunity to update the Census Bureau's address file that is used to distribute Census questionnaires to residents within their jurisdiction. Letters to the Highest Elected Official (HEO) of each local jurisdiction were sent out in early August and the Census Bureau held a workshop on the program in September. To have a full 120 days to review the address list, jurisdictions are required to register for the program on or before November 19, 2007. Additionally, members who sign up for the LUCA program by October 31, 2007 will receive their 2008 Boundary and

4b. 2010 Participant Statistical Areas Program

The 2010 Participant Statistical Areas Program provides an opportunity to provide input on revisions to Census geography including Census Civil Divisions, Census Tracts, Block Groups and Census Designated Places. MAG will be coordinating the Statistical Areas Program and staff will be serving as a liaison between MAG member agencies and the Census Bureau.

In addition to changes in Census geography due to new criteria and growth, there is also a need to address those census tracts created for Census 2000 that were renumbered or their boundaries revised in a manner inconsistent with Census Bureau criteria. This issue was brought to the attention of the MAG POPTAC at its August meeting and a map identifying the location of Census 2000 tract inconsistencies was distributed. This map was reviewed at a meeting with the Census Bureau on September 28, 2007. It is anticipated that a proposal will be developed for addressing inconsistencies that will be brought to the MAG Ad Hoc Subcommittee and the MAG POPTAC, early next year. A status report will be provided.

5. Update on Arizona Data Estimates and Projections Task Force Activities and Recommendations

In February 2006, the Governor issued an Executive Order establishing a Task Force to review and recommend any changes in the manner in which population, labor force, and employment estimates and projections are completed by the State of Arizona. The Task Force has developed about 30 draft recommendations for improving the methods and processes, which are currently being reviewed and refined. It is anticipated that a final report with recommendations

will be presented to the Governor within the next month. An update on the status of the ADEPT activities will be provided.

6. Status of July 1, 2007 Maricopa County Resident Population Estimates

The Arizona Department of Economic Security (DES) is in the process of developing a draft July 1, 2007 resident population update for Maricopa County. DES population estimates for counties are prepared by using a weighted average of the Housing Unit and Composite methods. At the October 10, 2007 meeting of DES Population Technical Advisory Committee, preliminary County updates were discussed. Once approved the Maricopa County update will be used as the control total for developing the July 1, 2007 MAG Municipality Resident Population Updates.

Due to deadlines for approving the MAG Municipality Updates and the schedule of MAG Management Committee and Regional Council, MAG staff has developed a draft set of updates based solely on residential completions provided by MAG member agencies (Housing Unit Method). The Draft July 1, 2007 Maricopa County and municipality resident population updates along with a summary of the methodology used to produce them are attached for your review. Since there may be changes to the State and county control totals by DES, POPTAC is requested to recommend approval of these updates to MAG Management Committee provided the Maricopa County control total is within one percent of the final control total. 7. Data Collection Efforts and Timeline

MAG collects data for a variety of programs. MAG has been collaborating with DES in the collection of data that will be used for preparing the July 1, 2007 resident population estimates. MAG supplied DES with data on annexations,

group quarters and residential completions earlier this month.

Other ongoing data collection efforts include land use information such as General Plan amendments and development projects. The land use data collected are used in preparing socioeconomic projections and conducting regional analysis. A schedule for the collection of data for the next six months is included in Attachment Two. A status report will be provided.
