- Includes joint transportation public hearing with court reporter to transcribe verbatim comments.
- All comments received during the mid phase are transcribed and receive staff responses.
- Comments and responses included in Mid Phase Input Opportunity Report.
- This report is distributed to MAG policy committees for review and consideration and a presentation is provided at the meeting prior to action.





Final Phase



- Typically held in early to late summer.
- Includes Transportation Public Hearing of Final Draft Plan and TIP with court reporter to transcribe verbatim comments.
- All comments received during the mid phase are transcribed and receive staff responses.
- Comments and responses included in Mid Phase Input Opportunity Report.
- This report is distributed to MAG policy committees for review and consideration and a presentation is provided at the meeting prior to action.

- Ongoing outreach through presentations, information booths, surveys, media outreach, Web and e-mail.

STATEWIDE TRANSPORTATION FRAMEWORK STUDIES

The numbers tell us that a projected 16 million people will live in Arizona by the year 2050. It doesn't take much to figure out that adding 10 million people to the state's current population will mean our state roadways are going to get a lot busier, or to conclude that Arizona's current transportation infrastructure is inadequate to handle the additional traffic that will occur when those residents try to get to where they work, live and play.



In a process known as *Building a Quality Arizona*, Councils of Governments (COGS) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) from around the state are working with the Arizona Department of Transportation, the Arizona State Legislature, the Governor's Office, and the business community to talk about state infrastructure needs.

This website is intended to serve as a "one-stop-shop" for information about local sponsored federal projects.

To receive federal approval to use federal funding allocated in the MAG Transportation Improvement Program for non transit transportation projects, local governments must first complete a federal design review and clearance process. This process is administered by the ADOT and establishes that a project fully complies with National Environmental Policy Act and that the project is bid ready or otherwise ready to begin work within three months federal authorization.

On April 1, 2010, every household in America will receive a short questionnaire in the mail that contains 10 simple questions. You will be asked the name, gender, age, race, ethnicity and relationship of all individuals living in the home. The form will also ask whether you own or rent your home. The 2010 Census is one of the shortest questionnaires in history and should take only about 10 minutes to complete.



MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

There has been discussion in the media recently regarding the status of stimulus funding and whether it is being "spent" quickly enough. I want to assure residents and stakeholders that the Transportation Policy Committee is keenly aware of the importance of obligating projects (meaning the money is programmed and the project is approved by the Federal Highway Administration) in time for the March 2, 2010, federal deadline. In fact, to ensure that we meet this goal, the MAG Regional Council has established an early regional deadline of November 30 for local projects to be obligated, or we will redistribute the funding to other projects.

That said, it is important to note that the federal process is complex and often difficult. MAG is working closely with its member agencies to help them navigate through the approval procedures, and we are exploring the possibility of providing some consideration to agencies on the November 30 deadline if the project is very close to being ready and it can be determined that it will definitely meet the March deadline.

The TPC recognizes the importance of the stimulus funding and the value it brings to our regional economy. We are committed to ensuring that this region not only meets the deadline and obligates all of our eligible funding, but that we are prepared and "in line" for any additional stimulus funds that become available from other areas of the region that are

TPC MEETING SUMMARY

ARRA Highway Projects Reprioritized

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) directs transportation infrastructure funds to both highways and transit agencies in states and metropolitan planning organizations. There are three areas in which our region is eligible for stimulus funding: Highway, Transit, and other (unallocated local) projects. In February 2009, the MAG Regional Council, with the recommendation of the TPC, prioritized five

As part of the research for this Resource Guide, a number of MPO PPPs were reviewed and several notable examples/elements are identified below. 


**Behavior Research Center Poll


