


Includes people who stayed in Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing, or Safe Haven programs.

The unsheltered count has been steadily increasing over the years. From 2019 to 2020 the unsheltered count increased at a **higher rate** than the sheltered and overall PIT count.

What is the PIT Count? The Point-in-Time (PIT) Homeless Count is an annual street and shelter count to determine the number of people experiencing homelessness in Maricopa County during a given point in time. This count is part of a national effort to identify the extent of homelessness throughout the country.
