



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Roadway Safety Program



The MAG Roadway Safety Program (RSP) was initiated in September 2019 by MAG to supplement the state's Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) program. The RSP assists with providing additional funding in the short term. MAG will facilitate a Highway User Revenue Fund (HURF) swap and regional safety program that can improve the safety conditions of our roadways in all areas, from rural to dense urban. MAG developed this program to address these critical regional funding needs in the near term.

The amount of RSP funds to be made available under a competitive call for projects process will be approximately \$2 million in each fiscal year through 2024. Calls for projects will be issued on an annual basis in August. The Transportation Safety Committee will provide oversight to recommending a list of projects to be funded.

Pinal County Arterial Bridge Program



On May 9, 2013, Arizona Governor Jan Brewer approved the MAG planning area expansion into Pinal County. The new region included the Town of Florence, City of Maricopa, parts of Pinal County, the rest of the City of Apache Junction, the Gila River Indian Community, and the Town of Queen Creek. The addition of this area brought a sub-allocation of federal Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBGP-MAG) funds. These are allotted statewide based on population.

Projects within this specific area qualify for funding in the Pinal County Arterial Bridge program. Such projects are roadways (including parkways), principal and minor arterials, and major collectors. Eligible activities include capacity expansion, rehabilitation of existing roadway and bridge infrastructure, and intersection and drainage improvements.

2020 Call for Project Applications

Program Goals:

1. Expand capacity on existing roadways or intersections of high demand.
2. Maintain and preserve the region's transportation system.
3. Address safety concerns in existing roadways/intersections.
4. Promote connectivity between high demand/high capacity roadways and activity centers to advance economic viability.
5. Maintain consistency with stated jurisdictional policy.
6. Achieve a significant reduction in congestion on the region's transportation system.


